#### South Featherston School Submission to Council, Wednesday 16 August 2023

Tena koutou, tena koutou, tena koutou katoa.

Your Worship the Mayor, and assembled South Wairarapa District Councillors.

Thank you for enabling us to be here today, as representatives of South Featherston School, to add our voices to those of others who are also concerned about the speed limits outside the schools and marae in our region. We know that this council, and the other authorities who make these decisions, all want to make sure every one of us get to school and home again safely.

Five years ago, there were other students from our school who came to these very chambers to ask that 40k signs be put up along our school's road frontage. You listened then, and we got our large bright signs, telling everyone that they needed to slow down around our school. Sadly, many drivers continue to ignore the signs, and the law, and we are here to ask you to listen again . . .

There are many reasons why we would like to see the speed limit reduced to 30 kilometres per hour, or even less, outside our school, and we wouldn't say no to some well-placed speed humps at either end of that zone, too, if that's possible, please. But first of all, you might be shocked to hear some statistics that we have discovered.

On average, every year, there are at least 30 children who are hit by vehicles outside their schools in the Wellington region alone. These are only the ones that are reported and are often only the most severe ones that end up with serious injuries or even deaths. There are many more unreported accidents that happen outside schools involving children and vehicles every year, and even more near misses that occur on a daily basis. At South Featherston School, we have certainly had our fair share of those.

We don't want to have one of those near misses resulting in one of us being terribly hurt or even killed. Reducing the speed would certainly reduce that likelihood . . .

One of the main reasons we would like to see speeds reduced is because the road that our school is on, South Featherston Road, is a very narrow and badly maintained stretch of rural road. We have massive potholes in front of our school, made worse every winter by the rain and mud, and our parents don't have a lot of off-road parking when they drop us off or pick us up.

Add to that, it is a busy farming area with huge stock trucks, tractors and other farm vehicles which are a constant hazard to negotiate through. At the end of last year, you may remember there was a massive explosion that was clearly heard as far away as in the Featherston township itself. That explosion was actually a truck that had a tyre blow out, literally right outside our school! The boom rattled the windows of our classrooms and we had no idea what was happening! The scariest thing about it, though, was that the truck slid out of control once its tyre blew, and just managed to come to a stop about 1 and a half metres from our principal's car. We all saw the massive skid mark and the gouges where the wheel dug into the dirt. If that had happened at the end of the school day, the truck might have hit our school bus, or it actually could have struck one of us kids – it had no way of being able to stop itself. Car versus kid is one thing, truck versus kid is unthinkable.

We really believe that the speed that vehicles should travel near schools needs to be a lot lower than what it is at the moment. The law says you're meant to go 20 ks past a stationary school bus, but that is ignored way too often. Little children are just not able to be seen easily in amongst cars, and let's be honest, the really small kids can be a bit out of control after school and can get away from their parents! They're quick!

By having cars and other vehicles slow right down, drivers will be able to react a lot quicker and there is a greater chance that a child might actually survive, or have far less injuries, if they are hit.

We hope that our voices here today help add weight to the argument for reducing speeds around schools and marae, and help you all make the right decision.
