My two weeks were split between school, a bit of family time, a lot of supporting my elderly mum and her health needs, and of course Matariki events.

Welcome: This week, we welcome Cobie and his family to our school whānau. Cobie has started his learning journey in our Junior Room, and he is our latest New Entrant.

The proposal is to have speed reduced to 30kms and we think that would be amazing! We were successful 6 years ago when we took a group of Senior Room children to stand in chambers before the South Wairarapa District Council and ask for speed signs to be erected at our school, with a requirement for 40kms during school hours. Let's make our school (and others) even safer and show we think 30kms would be even better!

Introducing . . . the Little Junior Room! As mentioned last term, I've split our fast-growing Junior Room into two. Kerri (Junior Room's Friday kaiako) is now teaching our six Year 2s and three of our more independent Y1s in what Kim (our cleaner) affectionately calls "The Little Junior Room" (previously the Y7/8 'chill space' – sorry guys!) and the name has stuck.
